

# MG boost for Perth company

A FLEDGLING Perth performance company is poised to become a force in the automotive industry.

Australian Automotive Components, which owns Sprintex Superchargers, has been given the job of boosting the performance of the MG ZT sports sedan.

MG Rover Australia plans to reveal the supercharged sedan at the Melbourne Motor Show on February 27. The car should be on sale by April.

Malaga-based AAC was founded last year and is backed by a group of Australian and overseas investors. It bought Sprintex Superchargers from Advanced Engine Components in October.

AEC, formerly an arm of failed Perth junior telco New Tel, shed Sprintex to concentrate on its core business.
